## R.E.S.P.E.C.T.

### Key Principles of Respectful Behaviour

**R**espect all participants and decisions

**E**ncourage everyone

**S**portsmanship

**P**lay for enjoyment

**E**ducate and be knowledgeable

**C**onduct yourself courteously

**T**reat everyone fairly

Do	Don't
Respect all players, coaches, officials, measurers, volunteers and spectators	Participate under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Or smoke/vape on the green
Participate in the right spirit – the sport should be fun at all levels. Be gracious in defeat and humble in success.	Use foul, abusive, threatening or discriminatory language or gestures
Take reasonable measures to keep yourself & others safe	Show dissent towards officials & measurers and their decisions.
Promote the sport and the club in the best possible light through your actions and behaviour	Discriminate on the grounds of any of the protected characteristics identified in the Equality Act 2010
Abide by the rules/regulations of the club, of the sport, and any additional competition rules	Publicly criticise or engage in demeaning descriptions of others, including online
Abide by the policies of the sport and its National Governing Bodies	Engage in any behaviour that constitutes abuse as identified in the Safeguarding in Bowls Policies.
Speak to someone if you are concerned that any of this code is being broken	Keep your concerns about abuse or poor practice secret
